Joshua

- Matthew 1:20-21; Deuteronomy 20:16-18, 31:23; Joshua 5:13-15; Genesis 12:6-7, 15:16; Hebrews 11:10

The JUDGES CYCLE (*Judges 2:6-23 Hebrews 11:32-39*)

1. The people rebel against God
2. God hands them over to their enemies
3. The people cry out to God in their oppression
4. God raises up a judge to deliver them
5. The people repent and follow God during the reign of the judge
6. The judge dies
7. The people rebel against God [again]

6 Major Judges: Othniel, Ehud, Deborah/Barak, Gideon, Jephthah, Samson [there were also 6 minor Judges!]

- Judge was Israel's leader who God chose to use to deliver them to restore the covenant relationship
Consider the Judges as positive examples of faith in God's covenant. How does that change things?
- Deborah: was Barak humble or too timid?
- Gideon: "God is your king"; maybe asking God for a sign wasn't such a bad thing to build his faith?
- Jephthah: Did he sacrifice his daughter or did she just never marry (text doesn't quite say)
- Samson: Is the typical assessment of Samson as too lustful missing the balance of recognizing his willingness to uphold the Covenant and even die for God's glory?
- Judges 19-21 After the deplorable activities of 19, Benjamites were devastated; Saul was a Benjamite!

Take Aways

1. Let scripture interpret scripture
2. Look for patterns and connections
3. Invite people to share scripture together
4. Recognize the spiritual war—it was messy for them; it is messy for us!
